Present: Mayor Berry Redfern, City Council President Jeff Pieper, Commissioner Daniel Grotz, Commissioner Leroy Ott. Also present: Sue Crawford, City Administrator, James Paul, Public Works Director and Garrett Williams HDR.

- 1) Open Meetings Act: Mayor Redfern announced the appropriate Open Meeting Act publications of the meeting.
- 2) Pieper moved for the approval of the minutes of the previous meeting. Grotz seconded and the motion carried.
- 3) James Paul, Director of Public Works gave an update on budget items related to the YASWA operations (slides attached).
- 4) Garrett Williams, HDR, announced an upcoming study that will help us determine if our projections concerning the current cell are still on track. He also noted that we would expect to be in design for the next phase in 2026 and building the next cell in 2027. He explained that the second cell of a new area has to come relatively soon after the first cell so that the cells can be filled most efficiently.

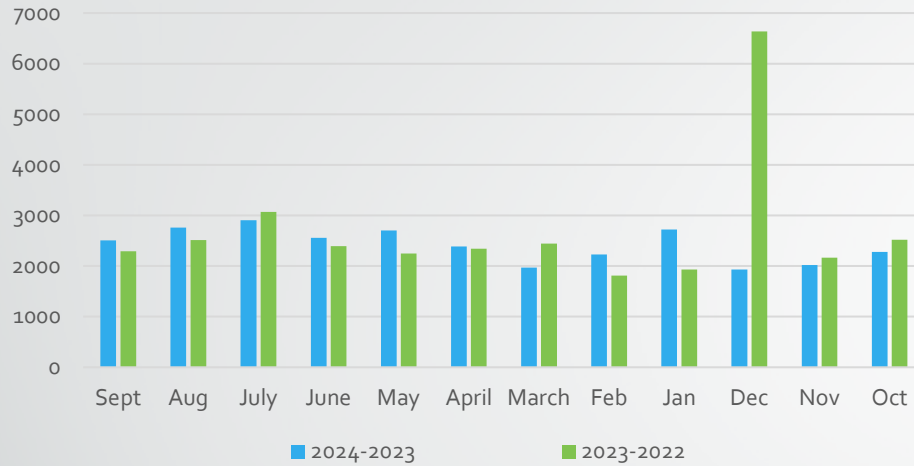
Revenue collected during September totaled \$198,230.25. The same period last year totaled \$142,732.50.

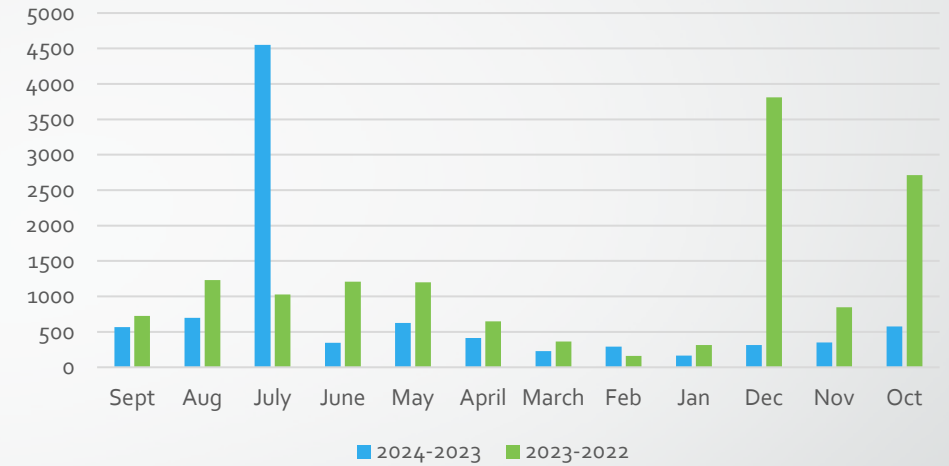

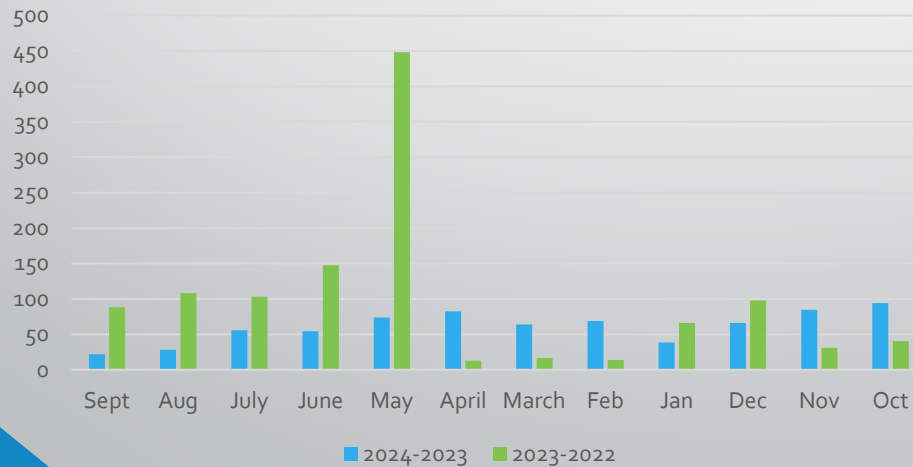
## Landfill Tonnage



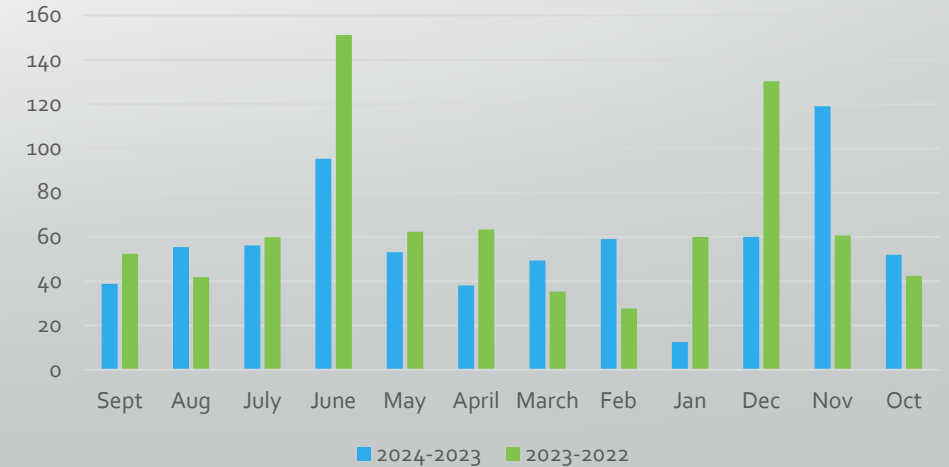
## C&D Tonnage
